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**REGULAR BOARD MEETING CONTINUED**

Principal Determan reported that prom was held on April 10<sup>th</sup> and that it went well. The high school and middle school track meets have been moved to May 8<sup>th</sup> and April 19<sup>th</sup> respectively. The middle school home golf meet has been moved to May 11<sup>th</sup>. The middle school spring concert will be April 26<sup>th</sup>, the high school spring concert will be April 29<sup>th</sup>, and the elementary concert will be May 4<sup>th</sup>. The plan is to have the concerts live streamed as well as live attendance. Awards banquet will be May 10<sup>th</sup>, with no food being served. Kindergarten and 8<sup>th</sup> grade graduation will be May 11<sup>th</sup>. May 12<sup>th</sup> will be elementary field day. The Last day of school is May 14<sup>th</sup>, with a 11:30 dismissal. Graduation will be on May 15<sup>th</sup> at 2:00 pm.

Superintendent Anderson stated that a new school vehicle has not been purchased, but is still working with Lamb Automotive, who has the state bid on vehicles. Hail damage repair to all the school vehicles has been completed. The busses have minimal damage still from the hail storm that will still need to be fixed. The homeland security grant has been submitted and the school is still waiting to hear back on if the award was granted. All of the findings from the special education review have been resolved. An annual election was not conducted because there was not a contested vacancy on the school board. This is required to be noted in the school board minutes per SDCL 13-7-30.

Karen Timanus reported on CORE that they had a regular meeting. Contracts were approved for the 2021-22 fiscal year. CORE joined the ASBSD health insurance pool for the 2021-22 year.
