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REGULAR BOARD MEETING CONTINUED

Principal Determan reported on various activities that will be happening at the school. The middle school band participated at the Tri-City Band Festival in Chamberlain. The third quarter ends on March 10th. There will be no school on March 11th and 12th due to Spring Break. Winter sports activities have finished and students are beginning spring sports and activities. All-state band will be March 26th and 27th. Christian Spann and Eli Barreto will be participating at all-state band. Dinner and a Show will be on Monday, March 29th. The home high school track meet is on March 30th. There is an early out on April 1st, and no school on April 2nd and 5th, due to Easter Break. Prom will be held on April 10th.

Superintendent Anderson stated that the Title I desk audit was submitted. The SPED teachers went to CORE for training in regards to the special education review that took place earlier this year. A new car was ordered that is to replace the two old Impalas. The homeland security grant was submitted. The process for the building repairs will be looked into and started in the near future.

There was no report on Mid-Central Education Cooperative. The meetings will now be held quarterly.

Karen Timanus reported on CORE that they had a regular meeting. CORE held negotiations for the administration. The director's contract was extended by a year.

Jason Frasch gave a report on the various bills that are being discussed involving education and its standing at the legislative session. Frasch talked about SB 177 and its standing at the legislature. This bill deals with homeschooling laws.

Old Business:

Superintendent Anderson stated that there will be no school board election. There were two petitions turned in for the two 3-year terms and one petition turned in for the one 2-year term.

New Business:

It was moved by Hull and seconded by Frasch to approve the consideration of School Board Policies, Section G personnel, GCQB-GDPC. Yes: All present. Motion carried.

It was moved by Schweigert and seconded by Hull to approve public school exemption K-20 & L-20 for the 2020-21 school year. Yes: All present. Motion carried.

It was moved by Schweigert and seconded by Frasch to approve executive session for student issue SDCL 1-25-2(2). Yes: All present. Motion carried. Entered executive session at 5:59 pm. Exited executive session at 6:15 pm. No motion made out of executive session.

It was moved by Schweigert and seconded by Frasch to approve executive session for negotiations SDCL 1-25-2(4). Yes: All present. Motion carried. Entered executive session at 6:15 pm. Exited executive session at 6:30 pm. Out of executive session, it was moved by Hull and seconded by Frasch to give currently contracted certified staff a \$2,000 raise for the 2021/22 school year and put \$1,700 on the base salary. Yes: All present. Motion carried.

It was moved by Schweigert and seconded by Hull to adjourn the board meeting at 6:32 pm. Yes: All present. Motion carried.
