

Dear Parent(s) and/or Guardian(s):

April 15, 2024

It is time to register your preschooler for the 2024-25 school year. Your child must be 4 years old by September 1, 2024 to register for preschool.

Preschool is tuition based. The cost of Preschool is \$30.00 per month. Preschool will start the week of August 28th. You will be mailed a letter with more details in August.

We offer preschool Monday and Wednesday 8:15 – 11:00 am **OR** Tuesday and Thursday 8:15-11:00 am. Please mark on your registration form which days you prefer and why you prefer those days. Example your work schedule, carpooling, who carpooling with, etc. This makes it easier for placing your child in the preferred days.

Please be sure to reserve your child's spot in preschool and return the enclosed registration form by **Friday, May 10th**. The completed registration forms can be returned to the Gregory High School Office. Once the form is received at the Gregory School District, your child will be registered. *Children enrolled in preschool also need to bring or send in with registration form these listed items:*

- *current immunizations records*
- *copy of certified birth certificate*
- *and social security number.*

Here is a list of supplies your preschooler will need for the first day of school:

- ___ 1 Pair of Fiscar scissors
- ___ 1 24 ct. box of Crayola crayons (**Please** have them be Crayola brand)
- ___ 2 plain #2 pencils
- ___ 2 glue sticks
- ___ 1 box of Kleenex
- ___ 1 pencil box that lid shuts tight and above supplies fit into it
- ___ 1 box of crackers for snack time. I collect all the snacks and at snack time I pick 1 box to share with the class. Example a 14.4oz box of graham crackers I will share with the whole class at snack time. Some examples of snacks are: animal crackers, Goldfish, Club crackers, bag of pretzels, box/bag of cereal, etc.
